From here, The Moana sails along the Croatian coast to three beautiful islands: tranquil Korcula, the reputed birthplace of Marco Polo; Vis, boasting 3,000 years of history; and Hvar, acclaimed as one of the world’s ten most beautiful islands. And explore two gems of the picturesque Istrian peninsula—pastel-colored Rovinj, Croatia, and medieval Piran, Slovenia—before returning to Venice, savoring memories of the perfect blend of fascinating history and scenic delights, shared with friends old and new

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Day 1: Embark the m/v Tere Moana in Lisbon, Portugal

One of the oldest cities in the world, Lisbon is the capital of Portugal and its largest city. It is also the westernmost capital in Europe—and one of the most beautiful capitals on the continent. Embark the m/v Tere Moana here, and enjoy time to settle into your stateroom before the ship sets sail this evening.

Days 2-3: At Sea

A transatlantic crossing is one of the great traditions of cruising. The advent of the steamship during the 19th century made seafaring far safer than the sailing vessels of old and helped pave the way for the Golden Age of travel at the turn of the century. It was during this era that the idea of travel for pleasure was popularized, and crossing the sea aboard a luxury ship became a destination in itself. Now you can relive this romantic era aboard a deluxe vessel that recalls the luxury of those distant days.

Begin with two days at leisure to experience the amenities of The Moana. Perhaps enjoy a live performance by our onboard pianist or watch a movie on the private DVD player in your stateroom. And make new friends over an elegant meal in one of the ship's two dining venues.

Day 4: Santa Cruz de Tenerife (Canary Islands), Spain

A beautiful port city with golden beaches, wide avenues, and lush parks, Santa Cruz is home to San Cristóbal de La Laguna, the first non-fortified Spanish colonial town and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Other city highlights to explore include the Plaza de España in the oldest district of the city and the largest square in the Canary Islands; the Our Lady of Africa city market; Iglesia de Nuestra Señora de la Concepción, the city's oldest church; the avant-garde Tenerife Auditorium; the Museum of Fine Arts; the Parque García Sanabria, an urban oasis renowned for its flower clock; and Playa de las Teresitas, a golden beach with stunning mountain views.

Days 5-11: At Sea

The Moana was designed with your comfort in mind, from her spacious staterooms and elegant public spaces to the host of amenities available for you to while away the days at sea. Enjoy a massage at the luxurious spa or work out at the ship's Fitness Center. Pick up a souvenir at La Boutique. Take a dip in the pool. Relax on a Balinese bed on the Sun Deck. Curl up in a deck chair with a book from our onboard library. Or simply choose to do nothing at all!

Day 12: St. John, Antigua

The sister island of the flat coral island of Barbuda, Antigua is the largest of the English-speaking Leeward Islands of the eastern Caribbean. Said to have 365 beaches—one for each day of the year—it boasts hospitable trade winds and a nearly perfect climate. St. John has been the capital of Antigua and Barbuda since the nation achieved independence in 1981, and as The Moana sails into port, you can recognize the city immediately by the towers of its magnificent, baroque St. John's Cathedral. While here, you may choose from a wealth of activities, ranging from diving or snorkeling to hiking, biking, and more. Or delve into the island's history at the Museum of Antigua and Barbuda.

Day 13: St. Barts, F.W.I.

Chic shops are a hallmark of this "Manhattan-sur-Mer" ("Manhattan on the Sea"), known for its duty-free shopping. Others include the island's balmy climate and brilliant blue skies, iguanas, and night-blooming cactus. Distinctly French in language, culture, and cuisine, St. Barts remains thoroughly independent in spirit. Enjoy excellent snorkeling and diving from the island's fabulous cove-style beaches.

Day 14: Disembark in Philipsburg, St. Maarten

The smallest island in the world to have been partitioned between two nations (France and the Netherlands), St. Martin/St. Maarten has prospered in peaceful coexistence for nearly 350 years. After breakfast this morning, you'll disembark on the Dutch side of the island, St. Maarten, where you can enjoy snorkeling or windsurfing, bask on the fine beaches, visit the Zoological Botanical Garden, and haggle at the duty-free shops of the capital city, Philipsburg.

Booking terms & conditions

Cancellations and refunds:

The following cancellation charges will apply to any cancellation by guests:

Date of cancellation charge:

121 days or more prior to Departure Date: Administrative Fee of \$100 per person

120 – 91 Days Prior to Departure Date: 10% of Full Fare per person

90 – 61 Days Prior to Departure Date: 20% of Full Fare per person

60 – 31 Days Prior to Departure Date: 50% of Full Fare per person

30 – 0 Days Prior to Departure Date: 100% of Full Fare per person

For this purpose, “Departure Date” means the date the sea, air/sea or air/sea/land program first departs and “Full Fare” means the full cost of any cruise, hotel or air component purchased from PGS or PGPS. Some components may have different refund and/or cancellation policies and penalties and, if so, these will be explained at time of booking.

Children:

Any child under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult over the age of 21. If the adult accompanying the child is not a parent, a “Parental Consent Guardianship Form” must be signed by a parent or legal guardian and received by PGC prior to sailing. The ships are not able to accommodate children under one year of age and reserve the right to restrict the number of those under three years of age on board. Babysitting services cannot be arranged in advance, and the availability of such services is not guaranteed. Parents must be diligent to guard their children while on or near the balconies or any railing. The ships are not equipped to provide pre-natal, post-natal or pediatric services.

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**Deposit and payment:**

A deposit of 20% of the fare is required within 72 hours of booking to confirm a reservation. Payments cannot be transferred to an alternative booking within 120 days of sailing. Unless otherwise noted, final payment must be received by PGC 90 days prior to date of travel. Final payment must be received within 48 hours of booking for bookings made 89 to 30 days prior to sailing. For reservations made 29 days or less prior to sailing; full and final payment will be due at the time of booking. PGC reserves the right to cancel any booking not fully paid at final payment due date. Payment may be made by bank wire, personal check, American Express, Visa or MasterCard. Once a deposit is made, all changes are subject to an administrative/cancellation fee.

PGPS arrangements will require payment at time of reservation/booking. Payments cannot be transferred to an alternative booking within 120 days of travel. Once payment is made, all changes are subject to an administrative/cancellation fee.

Dress code for evenings:

Evenings on board are elegant, yet they are not formal. "Country Club Casual," or resort wear, is appropriate for all evenings. For gentlemen, slacks and a button-down or traditional polo shirt, for example. No ties are required at any time, although gentlemen may wish to bring one blazer to wear on the evening of the Captain's Welcome Reception. For ladies, slacks, skirts or informal dresses are recommended. Please note that jeans, shorts, T-shirts and for gentlemen open shoes (such as flip flops, crocs or sandals) are not appropriate for evening wear on board
