Summary

Day 1: Embark the m/v Tere Moana in Lisbon, Portugal

Embark in Lisbon, and enjoy time to settle into your stateroom before the ship sets sail this evening.

Day 2: Portimão, Portugal

Located on the sun-splashed southern coast of Portugal, the Algarve region boasts an average of more than 300 sunny days a year and more than 100 of the finest golden beaches in Europe.

Set on the banks of the Arade River, Portimão features colorful architecture, as well as excellent shopping and an abundance of restaurants and cafés. The Moana will be able to sail up the waterway directly into Seville where big ships cannot.

Day 3: Cádiz, Spain

Surrounded almost entirely by water, Cádiz is the oldest continuously inhabited city in Spain and arguably the oldest in Europe.

It was as a great maritime center that the city earned its reputation, however—including serving as the launch point for two of Christopher Columbus's four voyages to the New World.

While here, you might visit the Old Town with its historic fortress, the Castillo San Sebastian.

And contrast its winding streets with the newer section of the city, with its elegant boulevards and excellent beaches.

Day 4: Gibraltar, U.K.

Encompassing only about 2.25 square miles and rising to a height of roughly 1,400 feet, Gibraltar is one of the world's most famous landmarks. Contrary to popular belief, it is not an island, but rather a peninsula, connected to the southern tip of Spain by a narrow, sandy isthmus.

Explore St. Michael's Cave, join a dolphin-watching expedition or view the island's most famous residents: its friendly and inquisitive Barbary apes.

Day 5: Motril, Spain

A pretty seaside resort in the Andalucian province of Granada, on the Costa Tropical, Motril features a historic quarter known as a fine example of Arab-Spanish urban development, as well as excellent shopping and dining. The city's Museum of Sugar celebrates what was the city's main industry for centuries. Enjoy diving in the warm waters off its many beaches, which include three nude beaches.

Day 6: Ibiza, Spain

The Balearic Islands, an archipelago in the Mediterranean off the east coast of Spain, are one of Spain's 17 autonomous Communities. Ibiza, one of four main islands of the chain, offers superb weather, beautiful scenery, exceptional beaches, and warm hospitality. The main city of Ibiza, also called Ibiza, boasts a history that dates to the ancient Phoenicians and Carthaginians, though it is better known as artists' and hippie colony during the 1960s and today as a popular getaway for travelers and jetsetters. While here, enjoy the city's charming historic architecture, beautiful beaches, and lively nightlife.

Day 7: Palma de Mallorca, Spain

Today features a call on the capital of Mallorca, the largest of Spain's Balearic Islands.

The highlight is the city's Gothic cathedral—one of the finest in Spain—built on the site where a Roman temple and then a mosque once stood. The Arab quarter—a warren of narrow alleyways housing museums, palaces, and courtyards—rewards exploration.

Yet, Palma de Mallorca also has a sophisticated side and offers the island's best shopping, restaurants, and nightlife.

Day 8: Disembark in Barcelona, Spain

The capital of Catalonia, one of Spain's 17 Autonomous Communities, and the second-largest city in Spain (after Madrid), lively Barcelona boasts a multicultural ambiance and a Mediterranean climate and lifestyle. You'll disembark the Moana here after breakfast this morning.

Cancellations and refunds:

The following cancellation charges will apply to any cancellation by guests:

Date of cancellation charge:

121 days or more prior to Departure Date: Administrative Fee of \$100 per person

120 – 91 Days Prior to Departure Date: 10% of Full Fare per person 90 – 61 Days Prior to Departure Date: 20% of Full Fare per person

60-31 Days Prior to Departure Date: 50% of Full Fare per person

30 – 0 Days Prior to Departure Date: 100% of Full Fare per person

For this purpose, "Departure Date" means the date the sea, air/sea or air/sea/land program first departs and "Full Fare" means the full cost of any cruise, hotel or air component purchased from PGS or PGPS. Some components may have different refund and/or cancellation policies and penalties and, if so, these will explained at time of booking.

Any child under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult over the age of 21. If the adult accompanying the child is not a parent, a "Parental Consent Guardianship Form" must be signed by a parent or legal guardian and received by PGC prior to sailing. The ships are not able to accommodate children under one year of age and reserve the right to restrict the number of those under three years of age on board. Babysitting services cannot be arranged in advance, and the availability of such services is not guaranteed. Parents must be diligent to guard their children while on or near the balconies or any railing. The ships are not equipped to provide pre-natal, post-natal or pediatric services.

Deposit and payment:

Children:

A deposit of 20% of the fare is required within 72 hours of booking to confirm a reservation. Payments cannot be transferred to an alternative booking within 120 days of sailing. Unless otherwise noted, final payment must be received by PGC 90 days prior to date of travel. Final payment must be received within 48 hours of booking for bookings made 89 to 30 days prior to sailing. For reservations made 29 days or less prior to sailing; full and final payment will be due at the time of booking. PGC reserves the right to cancel any booking not fully paid at final payment due date. Payment may be made by bank wire, personal check, American Express, Visa or MasterCard. Once a deposit is made, all changes are subject to an administrative/cancellation fee.

PGPS arrangements will require payment at time of reservation/booking. Payments cannot be transferred to an alternative booking within 120 days of travel. Once payment is made, all changes are subject to an administrative/cancellation fee. **Dress code for evenings:**

Evenings on board are elegant, yet they are not formal. "Country Club Casual," or resort wear, is appropriate for all evenings.
